

## Responding to the climate and environmental crisis

We are all going to have to change how we live.

We can choose to change how we live, or change will be forced upon us and our children.

- Not buying more clothes than we need.
- Buying clothes that are made of natural materials.
- Repairing equipment rather than replacing it.
- Not buying the latest version of equipment.
- Walking and cycling where possible.
- Taking public transport rather than driving.

## Changes to how we organise our lives:

- Switch electrical supply to a renewable tariff.
- Install solar panels, either for heating or electricity.
- Improve the insulation of your home loft insulation, cavity wall insulation, double glazing, whole house insulation.
- Install a heat pump.
- Use an electric car.
- Do not make excessive flights.
- Change job to travel less or be able to use public transport.
- Use delivery services that use electric vehicles.

## Acting as a community we could:

- Share equipment rather than each having the same equipment.
- Make known to shops our desire for less packaging.
- Make use of government initiatives to make our homes use less energy.
- Make known to politicians our willingness to see change to make the way we live more sustainable.
- Encourage the development of a circular manufacturing economy.

To prevent catastrophic climate change we will all have to work together. But remember that any change you make that reduces your carbon emissions does some good.
